LP Lasertech will provide according to the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 (so far as reasonably practicable) and to the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSH Act)

- Safe systems of work
- Safe handling, storage and use of substances
- Information, instruction, training and supervision
- Control and maintenance of the workplace
- Safe access and egress
- A safe working environment

Our policy will be delivered by generating a culture that does not tolerate threats to health and safety.

A positive and pro-active approach to Health and Safety issues is driven by all Senior Management through open communication and consultation both directly with employees and via the Health and Safety Forum.

The Group believe that people are its most important asset; their well being is essential to effective work performance and the provision of a high quality service. To this end, LP Lasertech shall ensure that financial and physical resource is available to meet our legal and moral obligations.
